

Science Study Table Information Sheet

Study hall is offered every Thursday afternoon from 2:10 to 3:10. Each session is on a 'first-come first-served' basis and is limited to 30 students. During this time, students are expected to work quietly and independently under the supervision of a biology teacher who is available to answer questions. *Students who have failed an exam are **required** to attend Study Tables.*

What would I use the study hall time to do?

- Get help understanding and completing current homework.
- Improve upon quiz, test, or lab scores if redone or completed in the study hall.
- You correct a quiz or test by finding mistakes (see the separate handout, 'Science Study Table Re-Grade Procedures'), re-answering questions you missed and recording the page number in the book where the information can be found. You can regain up to 50% of the points that you missed within one week of getting the quiz or test back from your teacher.
- Study table work must be done in study hall. When you have completed the quiz, test, or lab it must be turned into the study table proctor who will stamp and then return it to the appropriate teacher.

What can I not do in study hall?

- You cannot get stamps or points for assignments that you just didn't do. In other words, if you have no stamp, you cannot improve upon your grade, because you have no grade to improve upon. You can complete assignments that were "incomplete" or that you did not do well on the first go around, but you can't get credit for work you never did.
- You cannot come in to spend time with your friends who need to go to study hall. This is a quiet working environment and if you are not working you will be asked to leave
- You cannot just come in and ask for a stamp regarding work that you redid at home. You have to complete the work in study hall in order to get a study hall stamp.

Science Study Table Re-Grade Procedures

I. Introduction: You can do a re-grade during science study table for a test, quiz, or lab report you performed poorly upon. This sheet explains how to properly complete a re-grade.

II. Procedure:

- Prepare a separate piece of paper to be your re-grade. You **cannot** complete a re-grade on the original quiz, exam, or lab report.
- For true-false, multiple choice, and short answer questions, you must do **three** things for each missed question to earn re-grade points:
 1. Briefly explain with one or two complete sentences WHY your answer was incorrect.
 2. Briefly explain with one or two complete sentence AND in your own words what the correct answer is.
 3. Write the page number in the textbook where the correct answer/information is found.
- For essay questions, you must totally rewrite your answer on the re-grade sheet to make it more complete and/or correct.
- For labs, additional information must be written in complete sentences to correct specific parts of the analysis or conclusion sections.
- Staple your re-grade sheet on the front of your original quiz, exam, or lab report.
- Re-grades must be done within the following 2 Study Tables after an assignment has been returned to you.
- Re-grades must be given to the biology teacher in charge of the study table before leaving the study table session, who will stamp it and pass it on to your teacher.

III. Result: You can earn 50% of missed points on a quiz, exam, or lab report by properly completing a re-grade. For example, 16 points originally earned on a 32-point quiz but re-graded can result in a new score of 24 points (8 points on the re-grade plus the original 16 points).

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
